



Girls Gather for Computer Science is a non-residential summer camp for 7th and 8th grade girls. The camp will be run by female instructors including university faculty, teachers recruited from local middle schools, and undergraduate computer science students. The camp includes field trips to companies such as Intel and Vernier Software & Technology.

THE CAMP IS FREE! This includes tickets for public transportation (TriMet busses) to and from Pacific University, food, field trips, and an overnight stay in Seattle. This is a day camp only, with the exception of the overnight trip. There will be no sessions on weekends or on the 4th of July. The camp will last for four weeks, June 17 to July 12, 2013. The camp runs daily from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., depending on the TriMet bus schedules. Participants are expected to attend all four weeks of the camp. There will be two parent-student evening meetings: an orientation on Sunday, June 16 (Father's Day) and a closing presentation on Friday, July 12.

WHO: Girls currently in 7th and 8th grade
WHEN: Monday, June 17, 2012 – Friday, July 12, 2013
WHERE: Pacific University, Forest Grove Campus

Eligibility:

Thirty girls who are currently in 7th or 8th grade will be selected based on teacher recommendations and interest in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. Please use the teacher recommendation form found on pages 5 and 6.
